Homeland Security

- > Homeland Security
 - > Expends over 60% of Patrol Boat hrs
 - Patrol Boats Avg 18 escorts / month
 - Escort Duration from 2 to 15 hrs
 - > Also impacts other unit types
- > Multi-mission Units
 - > Units participating in homeland security also trained in fisheries enforcement
 - > Fisheries violations my be detected during patrols

































WA, OR, CA Commercial Vessel Casualties

- Operation Safe Crab / Halibut / Salmon / Squid
 - Approximately 1,500 dockside inspections in past 7 years
- > Safety Decal Program
 - 15-20% of West Coast Fleet vs. 5-8% Nationwide
 - > Decals valid for 2 years
