Staff Summary: The Council took the following action in response to recommendations of the Groundfish ESA Workgroup:

- Requested that United States Fish and Wildlife Service reinitiate ESA section 7 consultation for eulachon or modify the current Incidental Take Statement to develop a take estimate that accounts for the increase in eulachon abundance and includes the shorebased hake fishery, as well as bottom trawl and at-sea sectors.
- Requested that NMFS reinitiate ESA section 7 consultation for short-tailed albatross to incorporate new information on population status and fishery takes.
- Tasked the Scientific and Statistical Committee (SSC) with review of methods to estimate rare event bycatch in the absence of 100 percent observer coverage.
- Began the process to implement a logbook requirement for all commercial groundfish fisheries, especially for those fisheries with low observer coverage rates.

The Council recognized that implementing the logbook requirement will be complicated, although electronic logbooks could provide some efficiencies. The Council will consider scheduling action on this topic at a future meeting.

The collaborative group will continue outreach meetings and intends to submit a proposed alternative to modify EFH closed areas and rockfish conservation areas for the advance September briefing book.

• Sablefish north of 36° N. latitude: increase the daily trip limit (DTL) LE north trip limit to 1,125 lbs/wk and 3,375 lbs/2 months and the DTL open access (OA) north trip limit to 350 lbs/day, 1,600 lbs/wk, and 3,200 lbs/2 months for periods 4 through 6, beginning as quickly as possible in period 4.

- Minor shelf rockfish complex, shortbelly, widow, and chilipepper between 40° 10' N. latitude and 34° 27' N. latitude: Increase the OA trip limit to 500 lbs/2 months for periods 4 through 6.
- Blackgill rockfish south of 40° 10' N. latitude: increase the LE sub-limit to 1,600 lbs/2 months and increase the OA sub-limit to 550 lbs/2 months for periods 4 through 6, beginning as quickly as possible in period 4.
- California scorpionfish: increase the trip limit to 1,500 lbs/2 months for both the LE and OA sectors for periods 4 through 6, beginning as quickly as possible in period 4.
- Black rockfish between 40° 10' and 42° N. latitude: decrease the trip limit from 8,500 lbs/2 months to 6,000 lbs/2 months beginning at the start of the next bi-monthly period (either July 1 or September 1).
- •Adopt a 50 percent discard mortality rate for big skate caught as bycatch with trawl gear (SSC recommendation).

Motion: Adopt big skate trip limits of 35,000 pounds per 2 months for periods 4 through 6. Troy Buell/David Sones (Motion carried, Mr. Lockhart abstained)

Staff Summary: The Council adopted a revised skate discard mortality rate recommended by the SSC. Additionally, the Council considered the latest information on groundfish landings and adopted increases to the big skate trip limits for the Shorebased Individual Fishing Quota Program. Trip limit increases were also adopted for the fixed gear fleets including the LE and OA sablefish DTL fisheries north of 36° N. latitude; OA fishery for minor shelf Rockfish complex, shortbelly, widow, and chilipepper between 40° 10' and 34° 27' N. latitude; LE and OA blackgill rockfish south of 40° 10' N. latitude; and LE and OA fisheries for California scorpionfish. Reductions to the LE and OA fixed gear black rockfish trip limits were adopted between 40° 10' and 42° N. latitude. Motion: Recommend issuance of an exempted fishing permit (EFP) to the Alliance of Communities for Sustainable Fisheries as shown in Agenda Item E.2, Attachment 1 with the following changes.

- 1) One leatherback turtle mortality, or seriously injured as determined by the onboard observer, would terminate the EFP.
- 2) The EFP will include two drift gillnet (DGN) boats only.

- 3) Catch, bycatch, and bycatch mortality data will be collected from each participating vessel. Catch, bycatch, and bycatch rates will be computed on a catch per day and catch per set-minute basis as the two catch per unit of effort (CPUE) statistics used in statistical analysis. These rates will be compared to the average catch and bycatch rates for the 2015 concurrent DGN fishery outside the Pacific Leatherback Conservation Area (PLCA) and for the DGN fishery operating in prior years when fishing activity was allowed in the PLCA. In all cases, observer data will be the source of the CPUE data. NOAA Fisheries staff will be relied upon for the compilation of CPUE data or the appropriate entity.
- 4) The EFP applicants will consult with scientists about present-day ocean climate conditions that are thought to be favorable for identification of optimal time/area locations to conduct test fishery operations. This would involve the use of near-real-time oceanographic data to predict general times and areas where target catch rates are expected to be high relative to bycatch rates, especially of protected species. Once a test location has been identified, the boat captains will provide notice to NOAA fisheries of intent to conduct the test fishery.
- 5) At sea, vessel operators or onboard observers will collect the following oceanographic information at the time of DGN deployment, and again at the time of net retrieval: sea surface temperature (SST), water clarity, thermocline, and other information available from sonar, echo sounder, terrafin or other onboard technology.
- 6) Operators will keep a complete log of active tending methods utilized during all fishing operations, specific to the set, soak time, and net retrieval. Operators will also provide a written description of the reasons why the determined set location is expected to be optimal to maximize take of target species with minimal bycatch of protected species (i.e., no visible sign of whales/dolphins in the area at time of deployment; temperature/current breaks, etc.)
- 7) The EFP shall be conducted with 100 percent human observer coverage.
- 8) Gear modifications listed in Agenda Item E.2.a, Supplemental HMSAS Report, June 2015 will be included in the EFP.
- 9) A per year by-catch limit for marlins is to be developed by NMFS; if obtained, the EFP would close for the remainder of the year.
- 10) Pacific leatherback turtle critical habitat along the U.S. West Coast is a recognized sensitive area during leatherback migration and fishing in the area will be prohibited.

The Council also adopted the following management measures: for each separate fishing year, should the directed fishery realize the annual catch target (ACT), the Council should recommend that NMFS close the directed fishery and shift to an incidental-catch-only fishery for the remainder of the fishing season, with a 45 percent incidental landing allowance when Pacific mackerel are landed with other coastal pelagic species (CPS), with the exception that up to 3 mt of Pacific mackerel per landing could be landed in non-CPS fisheries.
