



AMERICANS DEMAND SWORDFISH



- The U.S. consumes more swordfish than any single country in the world
- Domestic swordfish production supplies less than 25% of U.S. demand
- Overall, 91% of the seafood consumed in the U.S. is imported. This is up from 67% just 12 years ago, creating an annual trade deficit of more than \$10.4 billion, which is second only to oil in the natural resources category

SUCCESS STORIES OFTEN OVERLOOKED



- Pinniped pops have steadily increased
- Gray whale removed from endangered list
- Humpbacks currently under review for delisting
- ENP blue whale pops recovered (Monnahan et al. 2014)
- ENP white shark pops healthy & growing (Burgess et al. 2014)




SUCCESSFUL BYCATCH MITIGATION

NMFS California Drift Gillnet Observer Program Observed Catch 2013-14 & 2014-15




