## RE: Agenda Item I.2 – Membership Appointments and Council Operating Procedures

Dear Chair Lowman and Council Members:

I write to express The Pew Charitable Trusts' support for Corey Ridings' nomination to the vacant California seat on the Pacific Fishery Management Council's (Council) Ecosystem Advisory Subpanel (EAS). My staff and I have worked closely with Corey over the past several years on West Coast fisheries issues and believe she would make an excellent addition to the EAS.

Since moving into her current position as a policy analyst with Ocean Conservancy in 2013, Corey has actively participated in many aspects of the Council process, particularly with respect to the Council's Fishery Ecosystem Plan (FEP) and its corresponding initiatives. On behalf of the Ocean Conservancy, she was involved in the development of the Unmanaged Forage Fish Initiative, and is currently playing a coordinating role for the conservation community as it seeks to participate in the new Coordinated Ecosystem Indicator Review Initiative. Corey has a keen understanding of the Council process and her focus on utilizing the FEP to help operationalize ecosystem-based fishery management in particular would be a great asset to the EAS, especially as this advisory body continues to help guide the development of additional FEP initiatives in the coming years.
