The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) and NOAA Fisheries will be co-hosting a workshop this June focused on artificial reef science and management. The workshop will be held at the Westin Alexandria outside of Washington, DC, June 9-10<sup>th</sup>, and we hope you will participate.
