## COASTAL PELAGIC SPECIES MANAGEMENT TEAM REPORT ON FUTURE COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA AND WORKLOAD PLANNING

The Coastal Pelagic Species Management Team (CPSMT) was asked to provide feedback on the potential applicability of incorporating the new carry-over provisions of the 2016 revisions to the National Standard 1 (NS1) Guidelines into the CPS Fishery Management Plan (FMP).

At this meeting the CPSMT and CPS Advisory Subpanel (CPSAS) were briefed by Mr. John DeVore on the staff white paper prepared for the March 2017 Council meeting titled Considerations and Focus Questions for the Carryover Provisions Envisioned in Revised NS1 Guidelines (see <u>Agenda Item C.2</u>, <u>Attachment 1</u>, <u>March 2017</u>).

The CPSMT had not previously identified a need for this type of carry-over provision, but briefly discussed the potential applicability in current CPS management. Based on the life-history of CPS (short-lived and/or large population fluctuations) and the current management structure (e.g., annual stock assessments for actively-managed stocks) the CPSMT does not immediately see the applicability for this type of provision. Therefore the CPSMT does not see the need at this time to pursue revisions to the CPS FMP to specifically incorporate carry-over provisions.
