Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in April 2017 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet April 6-11, 2017 in Sacramento, California to address issues related to salmon, groundfish, coastal pelagic species, Pacific halibut, and habitat matters. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the Doubletree by Hilton Sacramento, 2001 Point West Way, Sacramento, CA 95815; telephone, 916-929-8855.

Key agenda items for the meeting include Council considerations to:

- Adopt Final Management Measures for the 2017 Ocean Salmon Fisheries.
- Provide Final Recommendations to National Marine Fisheries Service on Chinook Bycatch Thresholds and Other Measures for the Endangered Species Act Section 7 Consultation.
- Adopt Final Incidental Halibut Catch Recommendations for the 2017 and April 2018 Non-Indian Salmon Troll Fisheries.
- Adopt Pacific Sardine Assessment and Final Harvest Specifications and Management Measures for the 2017-2018 Sardine Fishery.
- Adopt Final Preferred Alternatives for Small-Scale Coastal Pelagic Species Fishery Management.
- Final Action on Electronic Monitoring of Non-whiting Midwater and Bottom Trawl Groundfish Fisheries Regulations and Update on Exempted Fishing Permit.
- Adopt Groundfish Inseason Adjustments, as Necessary, to Achieve but Not Exceed Annual Catch Limits.
