Dear Chair Pollard and Council Members:

On behalf of our respective organizations, we write in support of Corey Ridings' nomination to the vacant California seat on the Pacific Fishery Management Council's (Council) Ecosystem Advisory Subpanel (EAS). We have worked closely with Corey over the past several years on West Coast fisheries issues and we believe that she would make an excellent addition to the EAS.

Since moving into her current position as a policy analyst with Ocean Conservancy in 2013, Corey has actively participated in many aspects of the Council process, particularly with respect to the Council's Fishery Ecosystem Plan (FEP) and its subsequent initiatives. She closely tracked the development of the Unmanaged Forage Fish Initiative, played a lead role for the conservation community in our work on the recently completed Coordinated Ecosystem Indicator Review Initiative, and is currently providing input via both the EAS and the Ecosystem Workgroup on the scoping of two new initiatives on climate impacts and socio-economic factors affecting fisheries and fishing communities.
