Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in June 2017 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet June 7-14, 2017 in Spokane, Washington to address issues related to groundfish, coastal pelagic species (CPS), highly migratory species (HMS), Pacific halibut, and habitat matters. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the Doubletree by Hilton Spokane City Center, 322 N Spokane Falls Court, Spokane, Washington 99201; telephone, 509-455-9600.

Key agenda items for the meeting include Council considerations to:

- Adopt Final Harvest Specifications and Management measures for the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019
 Mackerel Fisheries.
- Review CPS Aerial Survey Methodology and Consider for Final Adoption.
- Approve Final Stock Assessment Updates and Cowcod Catch Report for 2019-2020 Management.
- Approve Trawl Catch Shares Draft Program Review for Public Review, Approve Groundfish Fishery Management Plan Appendix E, and Provide Guidance on Intersector Allocation and Initial Priorities for Trawl Catch Share Follow-on Actions.
- Adopt Groundfish Inseason Adjustments, as Necessary to Achieve, but Not Exceed, Annual Catch Limits, and Other Management Objectives.
- Provide Guidance on Developing a Range of Alternatives for 2018 Area 2A Pacific Halibut Catch Sharing Plan Changes.
- Adopt Proposed HMS Fishery Management Plan Amendment 4 Language for Public Review and Provide Further Guidance.
- Adopt a Range of Alternatives for Swordfish Deep Set Buoy Gear Authorization and Permitting.

The public is encouraged to comment, either verbally at the meeting or in writing. Timing of agenda items may change as the meeting progresses, and items not completed on the scheduled day will be carried over to later in the meeting, usually the next day.

Oral Public Comments

Oral public comments will be accepted during the meeting prior to action on each agenda item.

Written Public Comments

Written public comments are accepted by the Council via one of the methods described below. The public is encouraged to submit written comments as far in advance of the meeting as possible, either by mail, fax, or email addressed to pfmc.comments@noaa.gov. Electronic copies of written testimony are encouraged, as they facilitate posting to our website.

- Written comments received after the deadline specified above will not be photocopied and distributed by the Council staff. In these instances, individuals are encouraged to attend the Council meeting and present their testimony orally and in writing. Written comments submitted in person in support of verbal testimony at the meeting will be made part of the Council's record for that meeting. For such late comments, individuals should submit their written comments to Council staff no later than 5 p.m. the day before the corresponding agenda item is scheduled on the Council's agenda. These written submissions should include the submitter's name, the Council Agenda Item Number, and the Council meeting date. Comments will be accepted in electronic form and hard copy. Hard copy submissions will be converted to electronic form for distribution. Council staff will distribute the written comments in electronic form only. The public should be aware that the Council does not have time to thoroughly review extensive written comments submitted at the meeting. The Council's advisory entities may not have a chance to review such comment at all. The Council will not pay for comments transmitted to the meeting hotel. Comments submitted that are not in support of oral testimony will be included in the briefing materials for the next Council meeting.

This meeting is open to the public and is physically accessible to people with disabilities. 
