Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in September 2017 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet September 11-18, 2017 in Boise, Idaho to address issues related to groundfish, coastal pelagic species (CPS), highly migratory species (HMS), salmon, ecosystem, Pacific halibut, and habitat matters. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the Riverside Hotel, 2900 Chinden Blvd., Boise, Idaho 83714; telephone, 208-343-1871.

- For such late comments, <u>individuals should submit their written comments to Council staff no later than 5 p.m. the day before the corresponding agenda item is scheduled on the Council's agenda</u>. These written submissions should include the submitter's name, the Council Agenda Item Number, and the Council meeting date.
- Comments will be accepted in electronic form and hard copy.
- Hard copy submissions will be converted to electronic form for distribution.
- The public should be aware that the Council does not have time to thoroughly review extensive written comments submitted at the meeting. The Council's advisory entities may not have a chance to review such comment at all.
- The Council will not pay for comments transmitted to the meeting hotel.
- Comments submitted that are not in support of oral testimony will be included in the briefing materials for the next Council meeting.
