**Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in September
2017 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries**

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet September 11-18, 2017 in Boise, Idaho to address issues related to groundfish, coastal pelagic species (CPS), highly migratory species (HMS), salmon, ecosystem, Pacific halibut, and habitat matters. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the Riverside Hotel, 2900 Chinden Blvd., Boise, Idaho 83714; telephone, 208-343-1871.

Key agenda items for the meeting include Council considerations to:

- Adopt Final Alternatives for Highly Migratory Species Fishery Management Plan Amendment 4 to update Status Determination Criteria and Other Issues
- Adopt a Preliminary Range of Alternatives for Authorizing Deep-Set Buoy Gear for Swordfish Including Federal Permitting
- Adopt Final Harvest Specifications and a Preliminary Range of New Management Measures for the 2019-2020 Groundfish Biennial Management Cycle
- Adopt Final 2018 Coastwide Non-whiting Midwater Trawl and Gear Modification Exempted Fishing Permits

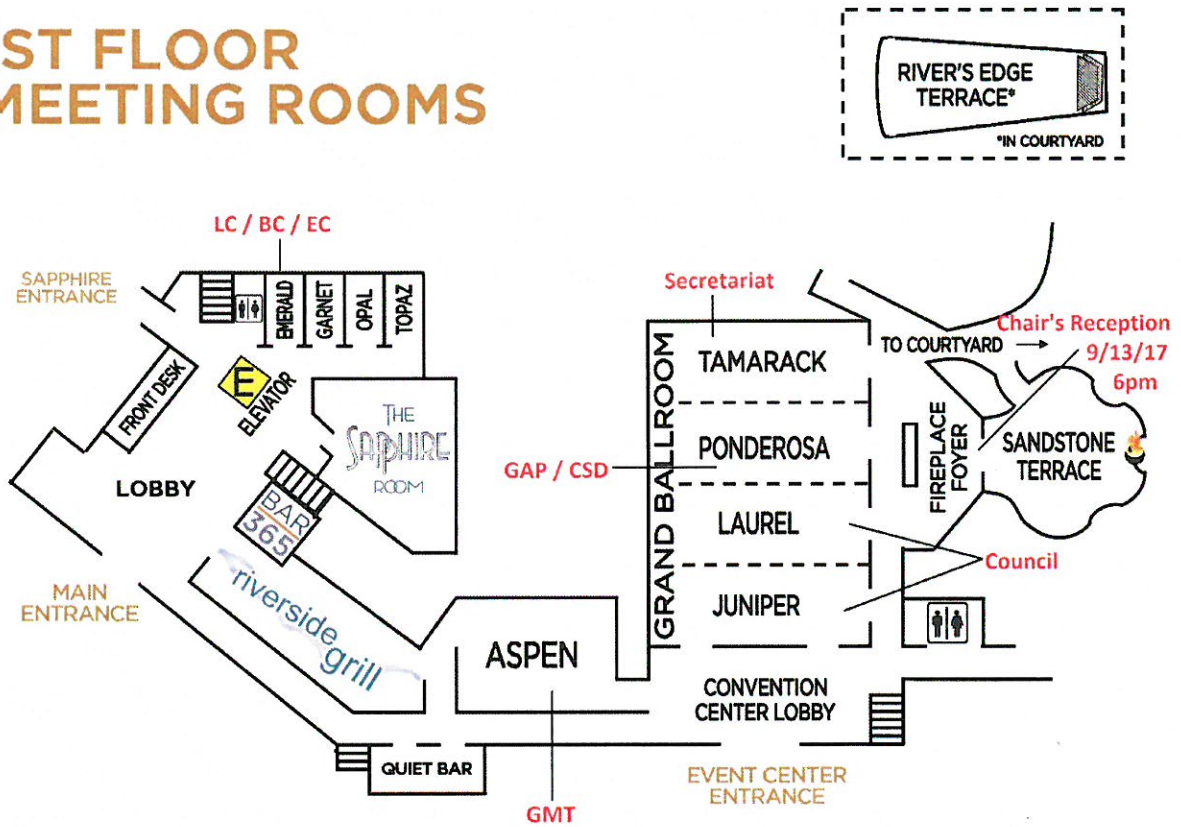
