





High Seas Drift Nets / IUU Enforcement


























F/V STAR KING

* Capsized*
January 6th, 2017

- <u>4:40 a.m.</u> Sector Columbia River receives a "MAYDAY" from crabber F/V STAR KING five crewmembers preparing to abandon ship.
- Two USCG 47' motor lifeboats and one H-60 Jayhawk helicopter launched.
- F/V SEA BALLAD arrives on scene and recovers all five crewmembers from the water.
- Survivors transferred to USCG motor lifeboat and safely returned to Ilwaco with no medical assistance necessary.
- August 2017 97 pots recovered from channel, preventing navigational hazard.











F/V NEW FAITH

Sinking

July 8th 2017

- <u>4:10 a.m.</u> Sector North Bend receives a radio call from albacore troller F/V NEW FAITH, with two crewmembers, preparing to abandon ship, 52 nm west of Coos Bay.
- Two USCG 47' motor lifeboats (one from Coos Bay and one from Umpqua River) and two H-65 Dolphin helicopters (one from North Bend and one from Newport) launched.
- Rescue swimmer deployed to assist with dewatering and communications with the vessel.
- Pumps unable to keep up with the flooding; crew was hoisted and returned to North Bend with no medical concerns.











Charter Vessel BETTY KAY

* MEDEVAC*

May 20th 2017

- 10:47 a.m. Sector North Bend receives a radio call from charter vessel BETTY KAY with a 54 year old male passenger experiencing chest pains, 13 nm off Bandon, OR.
- USCG Flight Surgeon recommended MEDEVAC via helicopter hoist.
- USCG Rescue Helicopter 6501 was diverted from a training mission and successfully hoisted the passenger and transported him safely to awaiting EMS in North Bend.
