Management Unit Species and Categories of Management

"In the Fishery" – CPS FMP 1.2

Active

- Pacific sardine
- Pacific mackerel

Monitored

- Anchovy (Central and Northern Subpop.)
- Jack mackerel
- Market squid

Prohibited

Krill

Management Category Distinctions

Active

- Annual/regular stock assessments
- New OFL/ABC/ACL every year
- Species specific harvest control rule
- Other management: Limited Entry, allocation, trip limits, closed areas or seasons, gear regulations, etc.

Monitored

- Assessed depending on need
- Multi-year, static OFL/ABC/ACLs
- Default control or species specific control rule
- Other management: Limited Entry, allocation, trip limits, closed areas or seasons, gear regulations, etc.

CPS Categories: Why and How

- Types of Considerations
 - Nature of the fisheries
 - Need for management
 - Agency resources
 - Life history characteristics

Management Categories

Prioritizes management and assessments; less about scientific information

Active

VS

Monitored

Category Assignment

Active:

"...biologically significant levels of catch, or biological or socioeconomic considerations requiring relatively intense harvest management procedures."



Monitored:

"... not requiring intensive harvest management (e.g., annual stock assessments and annual harvest specifications)"




Revising Category Names or Descriptions

 Should the Active and Monitored category names be changed?

• Should the category descriptions be changed?

Workload

- Category Name Change
 - More than one or two meetings
 - Amend FMP
 - Update Regulations, COPs, SAFE
- Improve Descriptions in FMP
 - One or two meetings
 - Housekeeping Update (?)



Enhancing Category Assignment Review

Monitored: "....and where monitoring of landings and available abundance indices and other biological information are considered sufficient to manage the stock."

- Improve regular review of reference points with SSC
- Series of review questions, Attachment 1
 - Annual
 - Document in SAFE

Recommendations

- Retain Active and Monitored names
 - Active and Monitored categories recognize that certain stocks require more conservation and management than others and are intended to allocate agency resources in light of this
- Evaluate, and potentially develop and recommend improved category descriptions
- Add new section to SAFE incorporating structured stock review
