# Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in November 2018 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet November 1-8, 2018 in San Diego, California, to address issues related to groundfish, salmon, coastal pelagic species (CPS), highly migratory species (HMS), and ecosystem-based management. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the San Diego Marriott Del Mar, 11966 El Camino Road, San Diego, California 92130; telephone, 858-523-1700.

Key agenda items for the meeting include Council considerations to:

- Adopt Preliminary Rebuilding Plans for Two Chinook and Three Coho Overfished Stocks.
- Adopt Final 2019 Salmon Preseason Management Schedule.
- Preliminary Review of New Coastal Pelagic Species (CPS) Exempted Fishing Permits for Public Review.
- Adopt a Final Preferred Alternative for CPS Amendment 17 Live Bait Allowance.
- Adopt Final Changes for the 2019 Pacific Halibut Catch Sharing Plan and Annual Fishery Regulations.
- Adopt Final Preferred Alternatives for the Groundfish Five-Year Catch Share Program Follow-On Actions.
- Scoping of Endangered Species Act Salmon Mitigation Measures for Groundfish Fisheries.
- Adopt Pacific Whiting Yield Set-Asides for 2019 and Adopt Final Inseason Adjustments for 2018 and 2019.
- Final Recommendations on Extending Existing Electronic Monitoring Exempted Fishing Permits.
- Preliminary Highly Migratory Species Biennial Management Measures and Status Determination Criteria.
- Deep-Set Buoy Gear Authorization and Limited Entry Criteria Update.

#### Meeting Arrangements and Public Comment Guidelines

All meetings are open to the public, except for a closed executive session scheduled for 8 a.m. on Saturday, November 3, to discuss litigation and personnel matters. The public is encouraged to comment, either verbally at the meeting or in writing. Timing of agenda items may change as the meeting progresses, and items not completed on the scheduled day will be carried over to later in the meeting, usually the next day.

#### **Oral Public Comments**

Oral public comments will be accepted during the meeting prior to action on each agenda item.

#### **Written Public Comments**

In addition to our current practices described below, we will be beta-testing an electronic portal for submitting comments at this meeting, with the intent of replacing the current email submission process starting with the March 2019 meeting.

#### **ELECTRONIC PORTAL BETA-TEST**

Starting October 1, 2018, a new E-Portal is in beta testing for the November 2018 Council Meeting. To access the E-Portal, visit the Council website (www.pcouncil.org) and click on the "Current (or next) Council Meeting" link in the top right hand corner of the Home Page. Next, scroll down and you'll see the link for the New E-Portal. From there, you will be taken to the E-Portal home page where you will need to select the meeting you wish to make a comment on. Next, select the agenda item you are interested in commenting on and either enter your comments in the text box, or upload a file containing your comments (in .pdf, .doc, .docx, .ppt, .xls, or .txt). You will be limited to one comment per agenda item in advance of the initial public comment deadline (Friday, October 5, 2018). You will then be allowed one more comment opportunity between 5:01 p.m., October 5 and the supplemental public comment deadline (5:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 23, 2018), which will allow you to review the advanced briefing materials, which are scheduled to be posted to the Council website or mailed out no later than Friday, October 19, 2018.

After the supplemental public comment deadline (5 pm on October 23), our current practices will be in effect (see below).

Public comments will still be accepted via pfmc.comments@noaa.gov, however, we <u>strongly encourage</u> submitting them through the new <u>E-Portal</u>, as by the March 2019 Council Meeting, the E-Portal will be the only electronic method to submit public comments (paper submissions via mail or fax will be manually entered into the E-Portal by Council staff for the record).

#### **Current Practices**

Written public comments are accepted by the Council via one of the methods described below. The public is encouraged to submit written comments as far in advance of the meeting as possible, either by mail, fax, or email addressed to <a href="mailto:pfmc.comments@noaa.gov">pfmc.comments@noaa.gov</a>. Electronic copies of written testimony are encouraged, as they facilitate posting to our website.

Comments received by 5 p.m. Friday, October 5, 2018 will be included in the briefing materials mailed to Council members prior to the meeting. Comments received *after* October 5 but *by 5* p.m. Tuesday, October 23, 2018 will be distributed to Council members at the onset of the meeting.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT GUIDELINES AFTER THE OCTOBER 23 DEADLINE**

- Comments received after the 5 p.m., Tuesday, October 23, 2018 date specified above will not
  be photocopied and distributed by the Council Staff. If they are emailed after that date, you
  will receive an auto-notification that the comments cannot be processed at this time, and you
  will need to re-submit your comments if you want them considered at a future council meeting.
- Late comments received after the 5 p.m., October 23, 2018 date specified above are required to be in support of oral testimony, and individuals need to hand deliver their comments (preferably in an electronic format) to the Council Secretariat (Grand A Room) at the San Diego Marriott Del Mar, no later than 5 p.m. the day before the corresponding agenda item is scheduled on the Council's agenda. These submissions should include the submitter's name, the Council agenda item number, and the Council meeting month and year. They will be posted on the Council's website.
- The public should be aware that the Council may not have time to thoroughly review extensive
  written comments submitted at the meeting. The Council's advisory bodies may not have a
  chance to review such comment. The Council will not pay for comments transmitted to the
  meeting hotel. Comments submitted that are not in support of the oral testimony may be resubmitted for consideration at a future Council meeting.

This meeting is open to the public and is physically accessible to people with disabilities.
