# Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in March 2019 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet March 6-12, 2019 in Vancouver, Washington, to address issues related to groundfish, salmon, coastal pelagic species (CPS), highly migratory species (HMS), Pacific halibut, and ecosystem-based management. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the Hilton Vancouver Hotel, 301 W. 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Vancouver, Washington 98660; telephone, 360-993-4500.

Key agenda items for the meeting include Council considerations to:

- Review Salmon Rebuilding Plans.
- Adopt Ocean Salmon Management Alternatives for Public Review.
- Adopt Public Review Options for Halibut Retention in 2019 and April 2020 Salmon Troll Fishery.
- Adopt Final Groundfish Inseason Adjustments for 2019 as Necessary to Achieve but Not Exceed Annual Catch Limits.
- Adopt Final Halibut Retention Limits for 2019 Fixed Gear Sablefish Fishery.
- Adopt New Sigma Values Used to Determine Acceptable Biological Catches for Groundfish and Coastal Pelagic Species.
- Approve Groundfish Fishery Management Plan Amendment 28 Language and Consider Adopting Revised Council Operating Procedure 22 for Public Review.
- Updates on Fishery Ecosystem Climate and Communities Initiative and Fishery Ecosystem Plan Five-Year Review.
- Highly Migratory Species International Management Activities.
- Comments on Proposed Rule for Anchovy Harvest Specifications (tentative).

The public is encouraged to comment, either verbally at the meeting or in writing. Timing of agenda items may change as the meeting progresses, and items not completed on the scheduled day will be carried over to later in the meeting, usually the next day.

#### **Oral Public Comments**

Oral public comments will be accepted during the meeting prior to action on each agenda item.

#### **Written Public Comments**

Written public comments must be submitted to our Public Comment Electronic Portal. To access the <u>E-Portal</u>, visit the Council website (<u>www.pcouncil.org</u>) and click on the "Current (or next) Council Meeting" link in the top right hand corner of the Home Page. Next, scroll down and you'll see the link for the E-Portal. From there, you will be taken to the E-Portal page. Select the agenda item you are interested in commenting on and either enter your comments in the text box, or upload a file containing your comments in .pdf. You will be limited to one comment per agenda item in advance of the initial public comment deadline (Thursday, February 7, 2019). You will then be allowed one more comment opportunity between 5:01 p.m., February 7 and the supplemental public comment deadline (5:00 p.m., Tuesday, February 26, 2019), which will allow you to review the advanced briefing materials scheduled to be posted to the Council website no later than Friday, February 15, 2019.

#### Written Comments After the Supplemental Public Comment Deadline (5 p.m. on February 26):

- Written comments after the supplemental comment period will only be accepted at the Council meeting and must be in support of oral testimony. In order to be available to the Council during an agenda item, comments must be brought to the Secretariat in an electronic format no later than 5 p.m. the day before the corresponding agenda item is scheduled on the Council's agenda.
- Comments received by 5 p.m. will be uploaded by staff to the Council's E-Portal shortly thereafter. Any comments received after that time will be uploaded the following day after 5 p.m.
- The public should be aware that the Council and its advisory bodies may not have time to thoroughly review comments submitted at the meeting. The Council will not pay for comments transmitted to the meeting hotel. Comments submitted that are not in support of oral testimony will need to be resubmitted during an open comment period for a future Council meeting.

This meeting is open to the public and is physically accessible to people with disabilities. 


