NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE (NMFS) REPORT ON EXEMPTED FISHING PERMIT (EFP) PERFORMANCE, ISSUANCE, AND RENEWALS

Notice of EFP Issuance in 2019

On May 8, 2019, NMFS West Coast Region announced in the Federal Register (<u>84 FR 20108</u>) that it issued EFPs to target highly migratory species (HMS) in Federal waters off the U.S. West Coast during 2019. These EFPs include standard and linked configurations of deep-set buoy gear (DSBG), as well as pelagic longline gear. NMFS renewed 21 standard buoy gear (SBG) EFPs for 2019 (Table 1). Ten linked buoy gear (LBG) EFPs issued in 2018 remain valid for the 2019 calendar year (Table 2). NMFS also issued a new pelagic longline EFP for two vessels valid for 24 months from the effective date (Table 3).

EFP permits are issued as exemptions from specific prohibitions under the Fishery Management Plan for U.S. West Coast Fisheries for Highly Migratory Species (HMS FMP). The general purpose of EFPs is to allow novel fishing practices and gear types that are not otherwise authorized under a fishery management plan. Specifically, NMFS will collect data on the effects and efficacy of using these gears to fish for swordfish and other HMS off the West Coast.

DSBG EFPs Active in 2018

EFP holders are expected to present a preliminary report on the results of the EFP to the HMSMT at the June Council meeting, per Council Operating Procedure 20 (i.e., Protocols for Consideration of EFPs for HMS Fisheries). From April through May 2019, NMFS received, and shared with Council staff, brief preliminary summary reports from DSBG EFP vessels active in 2018. The reports cover a range of topics including: gear performance, gear purchase investments, potential for gear conflicts, marketing and revenue issues, and other general issues encountered during EFP fishing. The goal of these preliminary reports is to highlight the experiences and takeaways of DSBG EFP fishing that are not captured by observer, logbook, or landings data.

Additionally, NMFS has compiled and integrated a number of DSBG EFP data sources to prepare a summary of 2018 EFP activity, and to analyze the Council's alternatives for DSBG authorization under Agenda Item J.6, Deep-Set Buoy Gear Authorization Update and Review of Analysis. Data sources include observer data, and fisher logbooks for trips where an observer was not on board. Table 4 provides a summary of DSBG EFPs active in 2018 based on these data. Note that LBG EFP vessels are authorized to fish both SBG and LBG configurations in any combination within a single trip, up to a maximum of 10 buoys or 10 sections and no more than 30 hooks. Often, vessels holding LBG EFPs chose to only fish SBG during an entire trip. Highlighted fields for 2018 SBG EFP table fields indicate less than 100% observer coverage rates; thus, some data for these figures are self-reported through logbooks.




Figure 1. Map of average position data for DSBG EFP effort during 2018.

Figure 1 shows a map of DSBG EFP effort during 2018. Note that the positions indicated by each dot are averages of latitude/longitude position data for each set over the course of a fishing day. Some of the positions are derived from logbooks and were not verified by NMFS observers. Therefore, the positions of each dot are to be considered estimates of average positions per day, and not exact locations.

Potential Council Recommendation on Extending DSBG EFPs beyond 2019

In a <u>report for the March 2018 Council meeting</u>, the Highly Migratory Species Management Team (HMSMT) suggested that the Council "schedule meeting time to consider recommendations to NMFS on the extension of currently issued EFPs that will expire at the end of 2019." The HMSMT noted that the Council "could recommend extension of these EFPs until full DSBG authorization occurs, unless circumstances require the termination of a specific EFP or EFPs." NMFS is prepared to extend active EFPs beyond 2019 consistent with Endangered Species Act coverage, if the Council makes this recommendation to NMFS.
