HIGHLY MIGRATORY SPECIES ADVISORY SUBPANEL REPORT ON EXEMPTED FISHING PERMITS

The Highly Migratory Species Advisory Subpanel (HMSAS) offers the following comments on Exempted Fishing Permits (EFPs).

2018 DSBG EFP Activity Reports

The HMSAS appreciates the time and energy EFP participants spent in providing valuable insights into the operational aspects of their fishing activities (see Agenda Item J.5, Attachment 20). A common theme among the reports was that economic viability was less than expected and was a concern. This is the most comprehensive information provided by deep-set buoy gear participants that are not affiliated with PIER.

Status of previously approved; but unissued, EFPs

Once an EFP application is approved, the fisherman is required to complete additional steps (protected species workshops, etc.) before that EFP will be issued. At present, approximately 50 percent of EFP applicants did not complete the additional steps. The HMSAS recommends that applicants be given twelve months from publication in the *Federal Register* to secure issuance of the EFP. After twelve months, the application would be deemed abandoned.
