Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold Meeting in September 2019 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) and its advisory bodies will meet September 11-18, 2019 in Boise, Idaho, to address issues related to groundfish, ecosystem, salmon, Pacific halibut, highly migratory species, habitat, and administrative matters. The meeting of the Council and its advisory entities will be held at the Riverside Hotel, 2900 Chinden Blvd., Boise, Idaho 83714; telephone, 208-343-1871.

Key agenda items for the meeting include Council considerations to:

- Adopt Final Rebuilding Plans for Strait of Juan de Fuca, Queets River, and Snohomish River Coho
- Adopt a Final Preferred Alternative for Highly Migratory Species Deep-Set Buoy Gear Fishery Authorization
- Adopt Public Review Options for Pacific Halibut 2020 Catch Sharing Plan Changes and Options for 2020 Directed Commercial Fishery Regulation Changes
- Approve Final Groundfish Stock Assessments for 2021-2022 and Beyond
- Adopt Initial Groundfish Harvest Specifications and a Preliminary List of Potential New Management Measures for the 2020-2021 Regulation Process
- Adopt Final Groundfish Inseason Adjustments and Consider Extending Midwater Trawl and Electronic Monitoring Exempted Fishing Permits into 2020
- Adopt a Preliminary Preferred Alternative for Salmon Mitigation Measure in Groundfish Fisheries

The public is encouraged to comment, either verbally at the meeting or in writing. Timing of agenda items may change as the meeting progresses, and items not completed on the scheduled day will be carried over to later in the meeting, usually the next day.

Oral Public Comments

Oral public comments will be accepted during the meeting prior to action on each agenda item.

Written Public Comments

Written public comments must be submitted to our Public Comment Electronic Portal. To access the <u>E-Portal</u>, visit the Council website (<u>www.pcouncil.org</u>) and click on the "Current (or next) Council Meeting" link in the top right hand corner of the Home Page. Next, scroll down and you'll see the link for the E-Portal. From there, you will be taken to the E-Portal page. Select the agenda item you are interested in commenting on and either enter your comments in the text box, or upload a file containing your comments in .pdf. You will be limited to one comment per agenda item in advance of the initial public comment deadline (5:00 p.m., Thursday, August 22, 2019). You will then be allowed one more comment opportunity between 5:01 p.m., August 22 and the supplemental public comment deadline (5 p.m., Wednesday, September 4, 2019). The advance briefing materials will be available for review on the Council website no later than Friday, August 23, 2019.

Written Comments After the Supplemental Public Comment Deadline (5 p.m. on Wednesday, September 4, 2019):

- Written comments after the supplemental comment period will only be accepted at the Council meeting and must be in support of oral testimony. In order to be available to the Council during an agenda item, comments must be brought to the Secretariat in an electronic format no later than 5 p.m. the day before the corresponding agenda item is scheduled on the Council's agenda.
- Comments received by 5 p.m. will be uploaded by staff to the Council's E-Portal shortly thereafter. Any comments received after that time will be uploaded the following day after 5 p.m.
- The public should be aware that the Council and its advisory bodies may not have time to thoroughly review comments submitted at the meeting. The Council will not pay for comments transmitted to the meeting hotel. Comments submitted that are not in support of oral testimony will need to be resubmitted during an open comment period for a future Council meeting.

This meeting is open to the public and is physically accessible to people with disabilities.
