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a/ Inseason estimates are preliminary.

b/ Non-Indian coho fisheries are mark-selective prior to Sept., and non-mark-selective recreational fisheries occur in Sept., (except NOF) see the regulations for details.

c/ Effort is reported as landings. Total allowable catch is 35,000 Chinook for Treaty Indian fisheries in 2019.

d/ Numbers shown as Chinook quotas for non-Indian troll and rec. fisheries NOF are guidelines not quotas; only the total Chinook allowable catch is a quota.

e/ NOF non-Indian troll chinook quota during the period July 1 - Sept 30 was adjusted inseason from the preseason quota of 13,050 when chinook remaining on the spring fishery quota were rolled into the summer fishery quota.

f/ Commercial troll monthly Chinook quotas may be transferred inseason on an impact neutral basis to the next opening period. In the Oregon KMZ, the Chinook preseason quotas were 3,200 in June, 2,500 in July and 1,200 in August. In the California KMZ, the Chinook preseason quotas were 2,500 in June, 2,500 in July and 2,000 in August.

g/ NOF recreational coho quotas may be adjusted from preseason due to impact neutral transfers between areas and from the NOF non-Indian troll fishery. The preseason quotas were: U.S./Canada Border to Cape Alava- 16,600 coho and 5,200 Chinook; Cape Alava to Queets River - 4,050 coho and 1,100 Chinook; Queets River to Leadbetter Point - 59,050 coho and 12,700 Chinook; Leadbetter Point to Cape Falcon - 79,800 coho and 7,150 Chinook.

h/ Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt. recreational non-mark selective coho quota may be adjusted from preseason due to an impact neutral transfer from the recreational (mark-selective) coho quota. The preseason quota was 9,000 non marked coho.
