

Vision

Goals should be aspirational Where do we want to be?

Objectives should be operational How do we get there?

Suggested revisions:

- Outcome-oriented goals and objectives
- Goals and objectives distinct from each other
- Clearer and more concise, more organized
- Aspirational and used for assessing tradeoffs
