I move that the Council adopt the alternatives described in Agenda Item E.3, Attachment 2 (section 4.2 Proposed boundary change) to modify the defined southern boundary of the KMZ from latitude 40°05' N (Horse Mountain, California) five miles north to latitude 40°10' N for analysis with the following addition:

Add a third alternative that would create a conservation zone between the current southern KMZ boundary at latitude 40°05' N (Horse Mountain, CA) and the proposed new southern KMZ boundary at latitude 40°10' N during years when Klamath River fall-run Chinook salmon are managed under the de minimis provisions of the Klamath River fall-run Chinook salmon Control Rule.

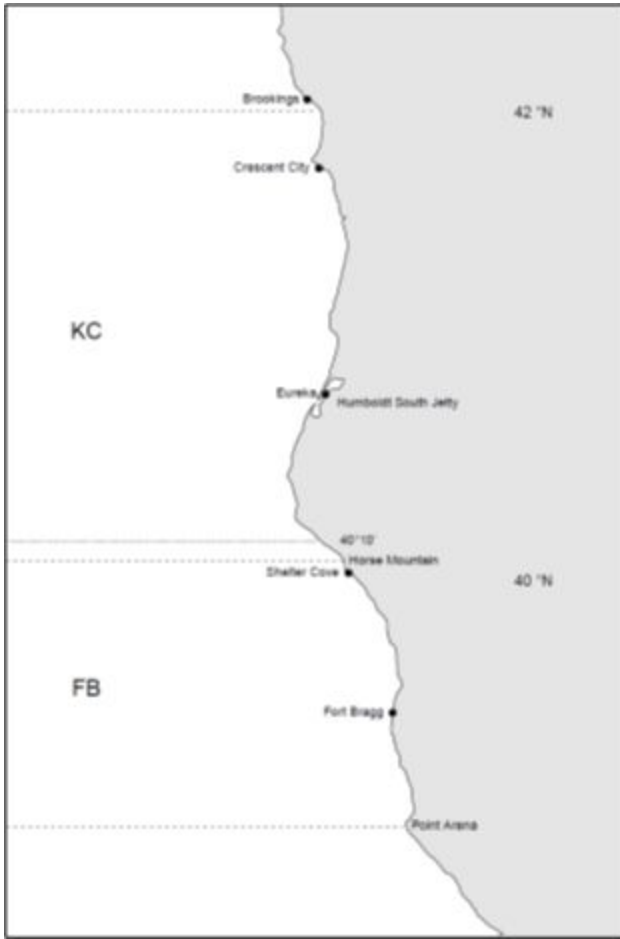


Figure 1. Klamath Management Zone and Fort Bragg management area showing the existing boundary at Horse Mountain and the proposed boundary at 40°10' N. lat., approximately 5 nautical miles north of the Horse Mountain line.
