

NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE ON EXEMPTED FISHING PERMIT

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) is providing this report to update the Pacific Fishery Management Council on the 2020 trawl gear exempted fishing permit (EFP).

2020 Trawl Gear EFP

The 2020 Trawl Gear EFP began on January 1 of this year. NMFS held an open enrollment period from November 26 through December 6, 2019. A total of 46 vessels registered for the 2020 Trawl Gear EFP and 42 of 46 permits have been issued. The remaining four vessels do not meet EFP eligibility requirements at this time.

As of October 26, 19 vessels have participated in the Trawl Gear EFP during the 2020 fishing year. These vessels have caught 25 Chinook salmon, 3,270 eulachon, zero sturgeon, one coho salmon, and approximately 10.7 million pounds of groundfish, totaling approximately \$3.5 million in revenue. Of the 25 Chinook salmon, 23 were caught north of 42° North latitude (N. lat.) and two were caught south of 42° N. lat. (See Table 1).
