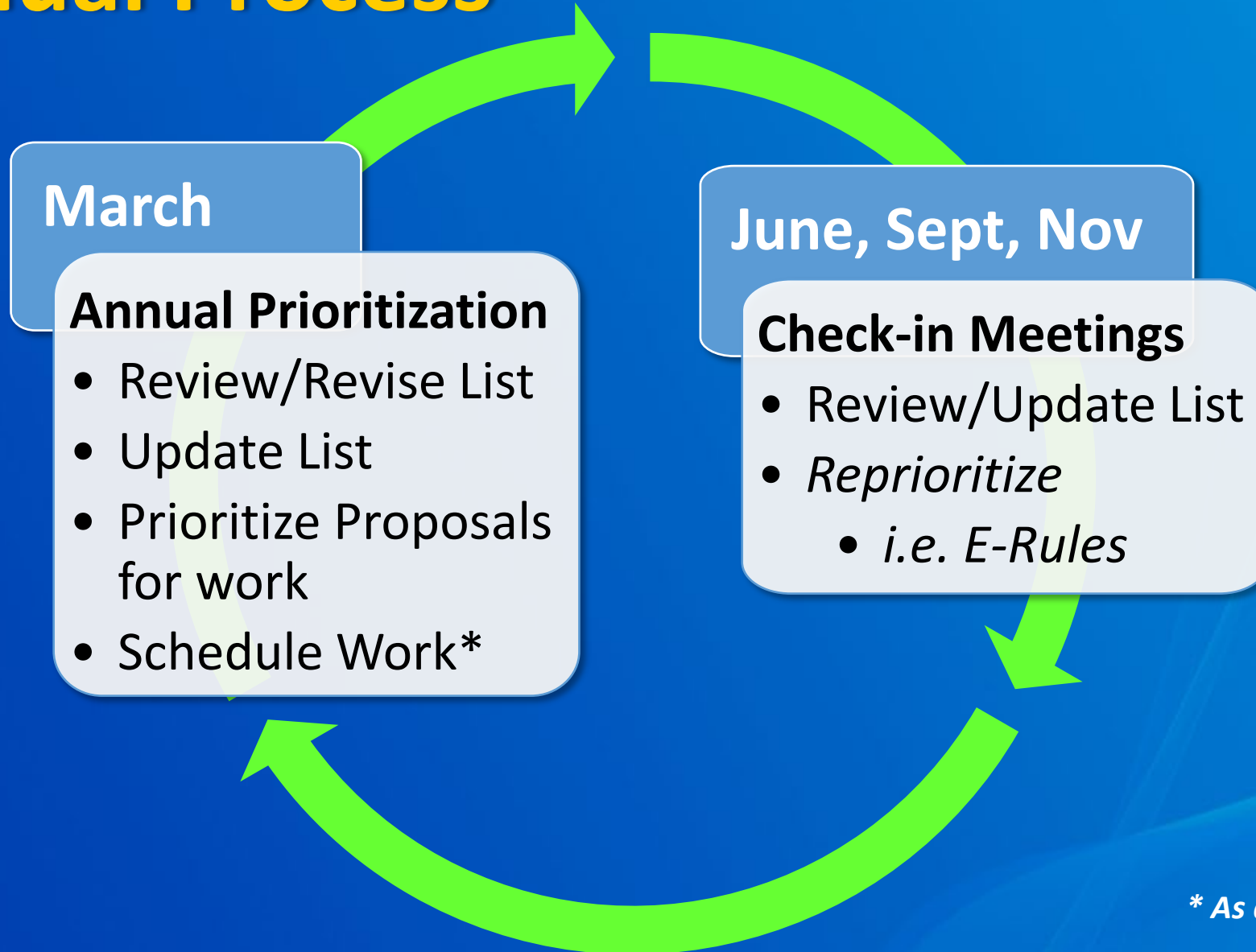

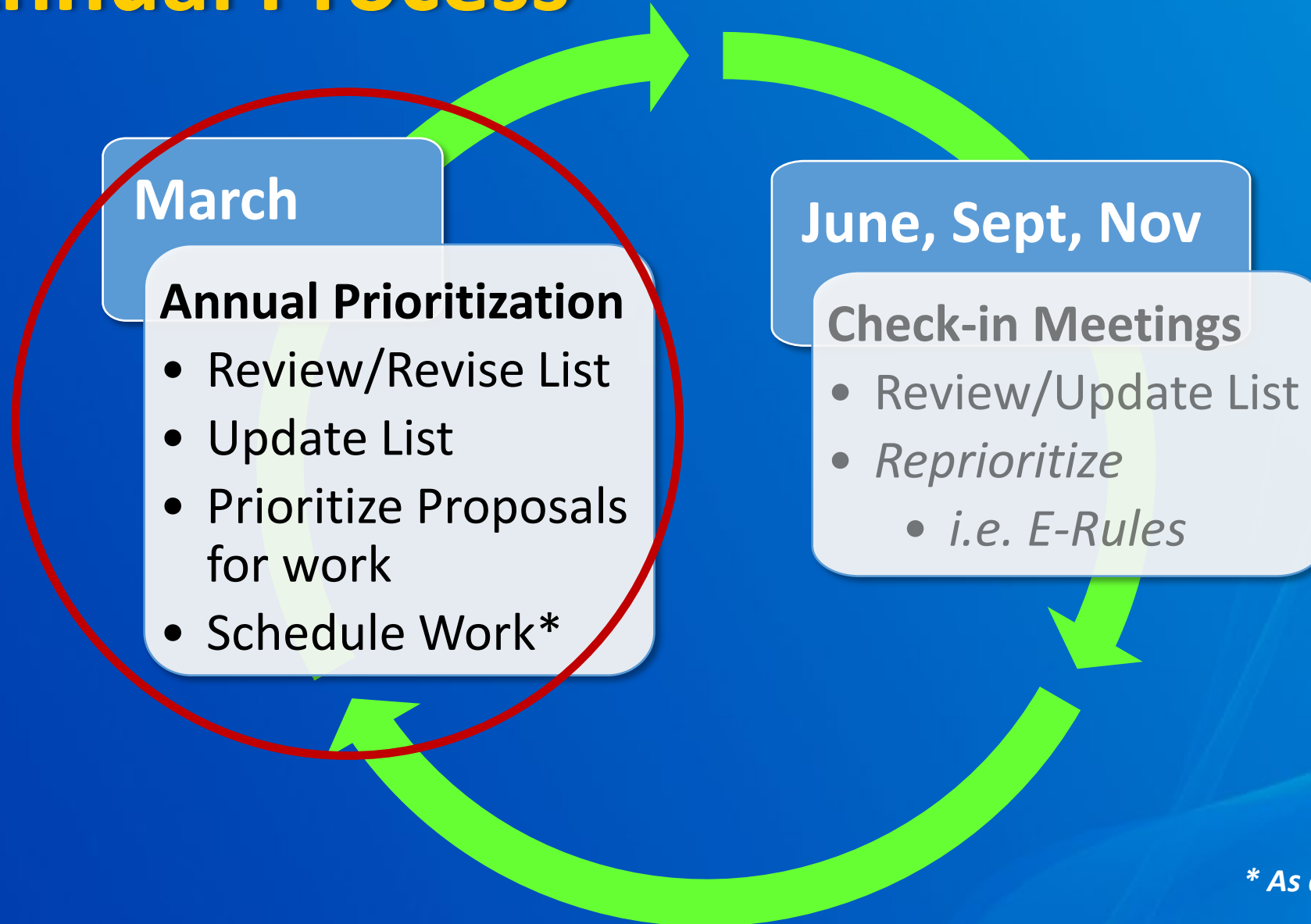

March: Annual Prioritization Tasks

1. New management measure proposals may be submitted.
2. GMT and GAP
 - a) Review/Revise/Update management measure list
 - b) cursory scoping of new proposals by GMT
 - c) GMT/GAP offers recommendations regarding proposals
3. Council Action
 - a) Considers revisions to list
 - b) May adopt updated list
 - c) May prioritize items for work
 - d) May direct GMT/GAP to further develop items

Prioritized Proposals

- Mothership Utilization – *scoping under G.4*
- Non-Trawl RCA Modifications – *April 2021*
- Moving Emley-Platt EFP into Regulation – *April 2021*
- Trawl/Non-Trawl Amendment 21 Allocations – completed?

Proposed

- 14 proposals ‘unprioritized’ management measure

- Five measures, including two emergency actions

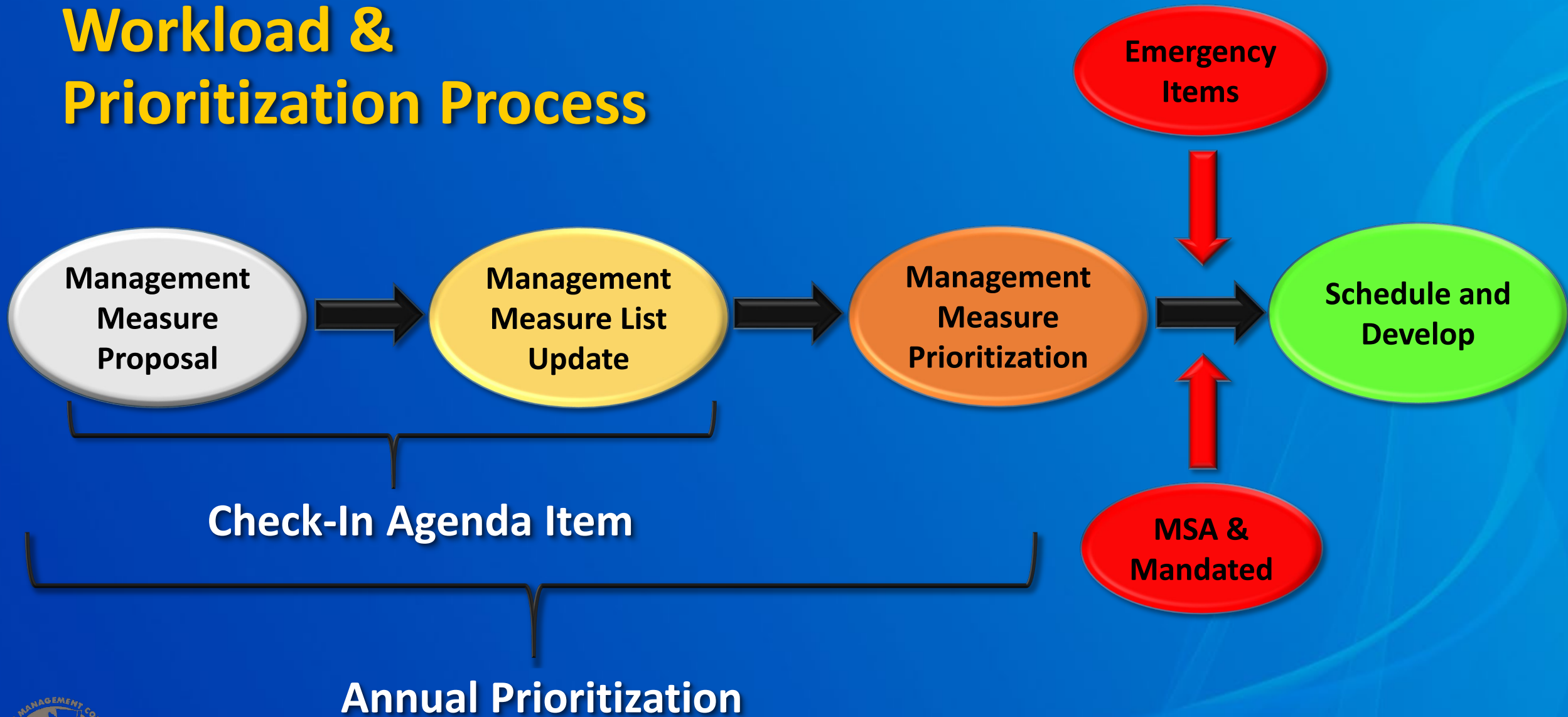

1. New process to replace Omnibus

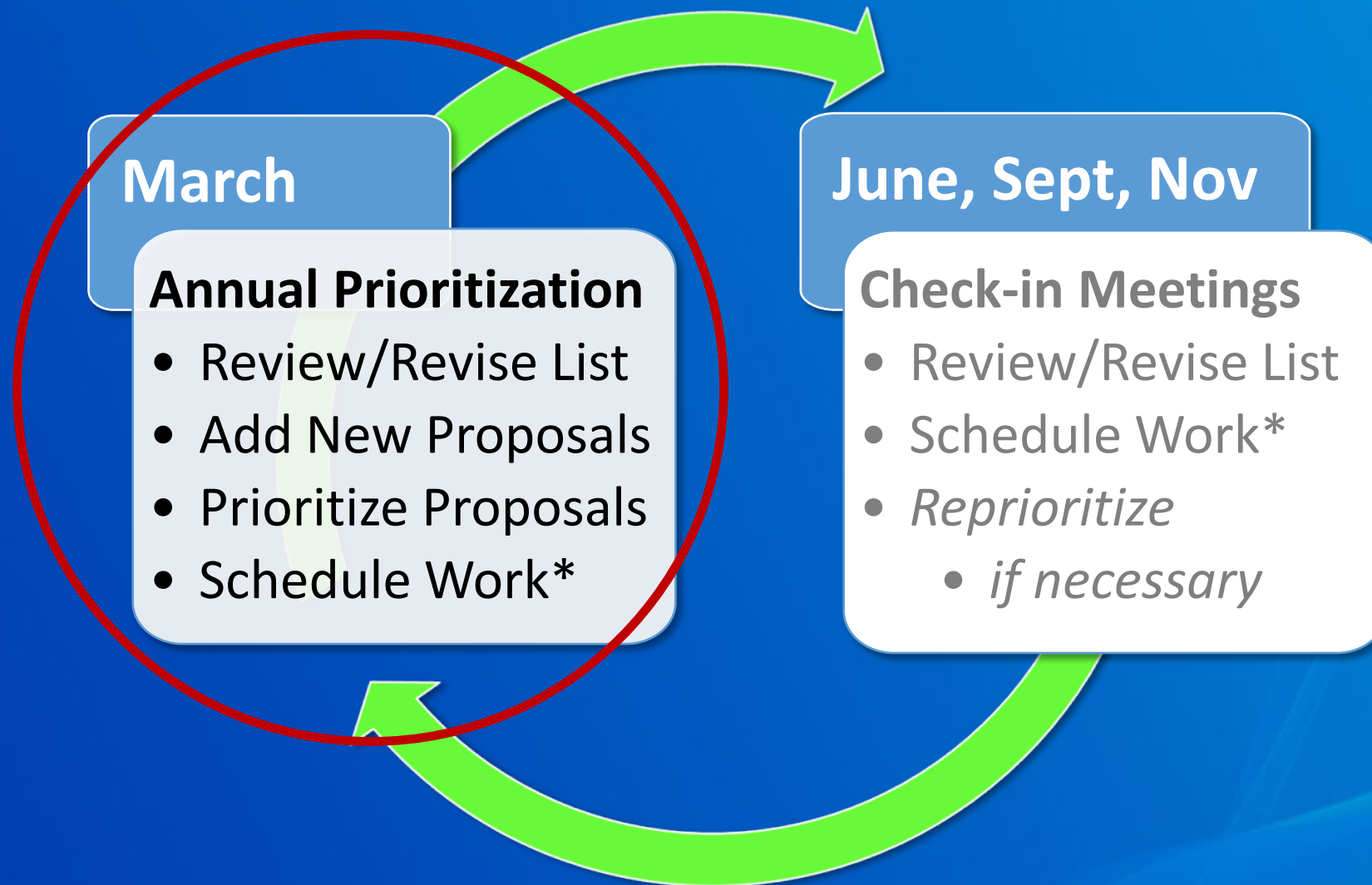
2. Concept
