PACIFIC MACKEREL ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT MEASURES

At this meeting, the Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) will adopt management and harvest specifications for Pacific mackerel, including overfishing limit (OFL), acceptable biological catch (ABC), and annual catch limit (ACL), for two consecutive fishing years (2021-22 and 2022-23). The Council may also choose to adopt an annual catch target (ACT), as with the past two fishing years. The fishing year for Pacific mackerel begins July 1 and ends June 30 of the following year.

A stock assessment team from the National Marine Fisheries Service Southwest Fisheries Science Center produced a catch-only projection estimate (Agenda Item H.2, Attachment 1), in accordance with Council Operating Procedure 9, which calls for a full benchmark stock assessment every four years, with a catch-only projection estimate for the alternating four years. This estimate will be reviewed by the full Scientific and Statistical Committee (SSC) during the June Council meeting.

Council Action:

- 1. Adopt the Pacific Mackerel Stock Assessment.
- 2. Select P*, ABC, ACL, and if appropriate, ACT specifications and management measures.
- 3. Adopt incidental catch allowances for Coastal Pelagic Species (CPS) and non-CPS fisheries.
