Action Item #12a: CCA Repeal

- Potential high workload and not necessary for implementation by Jan. 1, 2023,
- Therefore, the GMT recommends this item be moved back into the E.6 Non-trawl Rockfish Conservation Area item to be discussed at this meeting

Action Item #12b: Directed Shortbelly Rockfish Prohibition

- Potential high workload and not necessary for Jan. 1, 2023 implementation,
- Therefore, the GMT recommends that the Council move this management measure out of the harvest specifications cycle
- Two pathways identified:
 - stand-alone groundfish FMP amendment, or
 - addition to the list of shared ecosystem component species,
 which would require amendment of all of the Council's FMPs.

Action Item #12c: Salmon Troll Incidental Groundfish Limits

- The GMT has suggested a holistic look at groundfish retention in the salmon troll fishery
 - Do not believe this item needs to be done by Jan. 1,
 2023, or as part of the biennial process
 - Could be agendized as a stand-alone item and considered for prioritization under future workload and planning

Action Item #12d: Rebuilding Plans

- Quillback rockfish off CA:
 - \circ $T_{MIN} = 2040$
 - \circ T_{MAX} = 2066 (T_{MIN} + 26 years [one mean generation time])
 - Draft rebuilding analysis range of SPR would successfully rebuild the stock by 2066 or earlier

The GMT would like to request additional runs of a SPR harvest rate at 0.55 and 0.65 to further examine the trade-offs of alternative rebuilding strategies

- Copper rockfish off CA, south of Point Conception:
 - \circ T_{MIN} = 2033 (within 10 years)
 - \circ $T_{MAX} = 2033$

 - Only viable alternatives would rebuild the stock by 2033 (SPR ≥ 0.935)
 Pooling spawning output across California results in a statewide fraction unfished of 31.7 percent, above the Minimum Stock Size Threshold (MSST)

Action Item #12e: Groundfish Retention in the Non-trawl Rockfish Conservation Area with Select Gear Types

- Groundfish Advisory Subpanel (GAP) is proposing a new management measure that would authorize selected hook and line gears within the Non-trawl RCA South of 46° 16' N. lat. (the WA/OR Border)
- Due to the late timing, the GMT was unable to discuss this proposal in detail and does not provide a recommendation.

Action Item #13: Shorebased IFQ

 The GMT has not received any requests for changes to the shorebased IFQ trip limits at this time

Action Item #14a: Open Access Fixed Gear Fisheries North of 40° 10' N lat.

Sablefish:

- Status Quo: Maintain the 600-lb. daily limit in the sablefish OA DTL sector
- Option 1: Remove the 600-lb. daily limit
 - o 2,000 lb. weekly and 4,000 lb. bimonthly limits would remain

Quillback Rockfish: Adjust bimonthly limits to implement 2023-24 harvest specifications

Action Item #14b: Open Access Fixed Gear Fisheries South of 40° 10' N lat.

Sablefish:

2019-2020 limits: 1,600 lbs./week, 4,800 lbs./2 months

Status Quo (2021-2022): 2,000 lbs./week, 6,000 lbs./2 months

- Highest they have been since 2010
- No requests to change

Quillback Rockfish: Adjust bimonthly limits to implement 2023-24 harvest specifications

Action Item #15a. Limited Entry Fixed Gear Fisheries North of 40° 10′ N lat.

Sablefish:

2021-2022 limits: 1,700 lbs./week, 5,100 lbs./2 months Options to analyze:

- Status Quo: 1,700 lbs./week, 5,100 lbs./2 months
- Option 1: 2,400 lbs./week, 4,800 lbs./2 months

<u>Quillback Rockfish:</u> Adjust bimonthly limits to implement 2023-24 harvest specifications

Action Item #15b. Limited Entry Fixed Gear Fisheries South of 40° 10′ N lat.

Sablefish:

Status Quo (2021-2022): 2,500 lbs./week

- Highest they have been since 2010
- No requests to change

Quillback Rockfish: Adjust bimonthly limits to implement 2023-24 harvest specifications

Action Item #15c. Limited Entry Fixed Gear Primary Sablefish Tier Fishery

Extend the season from October 31 to December 31

Could be taken up under either:

- 2023-24 biennial harvest specifications process
 ~OR~
- The Fixed Gear Catch Share Program Review, which is currently scheduled on the Year-at-a-Glance for June 2022
- GMT does not provide a recommendation as to what pathway
