# EXEMPTED FISHING PERMITS (EFPs) FOR 2022-2023 - FINAL ACTION

The Coastal Pelagic Species (CPS) Fishery Management Plan allows for EFP activities to be conducted under a permit issued by the National Marine Fisheries Service. Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) Operating Procedure 23 describes the process for proposing EFPs, in which initial consideration occurs at the November Council meeting, with final action scheduled for the subsequent March or April Council meeting.

Three EFP notices of intent were submitted for the November 2021 Council meeting and were approved for consideration of full proposals at the April 2022 meeting. If approved, the allowed take of Pacific sardine under EFPs will be considered along with the management measures for the 2022-2023 Pacific sardine management measures (see Agenda Item E.3). The proposals are included in April Briefing Book materials (Agenda Item E.2, Attachments 1, 2 and 3).
