The National Marine Fisheries Service' (NMFS) West Coast Region (WCR) is proud of its long-standing positive and productive partnership with the Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) in managing fisheries resources off the U.S. West Coast. As transitions occur, we remain committed to maintaining this relationship. As the Council is aware, Mr. Barry Thom left the WCR in March 2022. I would like to notify the Council of my appointment as acting Regional Administrator (RA). The WCR would also like to request two additions to its designees for the RA.
