
David A. Jincks

February 12, 1952 – May 24, 2022

David A. Jincks, age 70, passed away on May 24, 2022, after suffering 10 months with Glioblastoma, an aggressive and fast growing form of brain cancer. David was born February 12, 1952 in Eugene, Oregon to Arthur and Flora Jincks. He was the third of their four sons. In 1963, at age eleven, David moved to Newport with his family and graduated from Newport High School in 1971. During high school, he spent summers commercial fishing for salmon and tuna. In 1972 he lost his pollywog tail and became a shellback when he crossed the equator aboard the Research Vessel Yaquina. After returning to Newport, David commercial fished from California to the Bering Sea. In 1986 he traveled to the Soviet Union with a delegation of west coast fisherman to continue negotiations for the whiting joint venture. He twice served as a Newport port commissioner, and also served as the president of the MidWater Trawl Cooperative.

David knew where to find all the good things in life, which he most often found behind a DO NOT ENTER sign. He loved a practical joke, even when he was on the receiving end, and he generously shared his sense of fun. But to the disappointment of many, he never divulged the recipe for his secret sauce.

David married Connie Lyons on December 16, 1977 in Lake Tahoe, Nevada. They had two sons, Lyle and Larry, and



continued to make their home in Newport. After retiring from fishing, David and Connie moved to an acreage east of Bend.

David was preceded in death by his parents Arthur and Flora Jincks, and younger brother Lawrence (Larry) Jincks. He is survived by his wife Connie; sons Lyle Jincks of Bend and Larry Jincks of Newport; grandson Kai Jincks of Bend; brothers Rodger (Linda) Jincks of Lapine and Leland (Jane) Jincks of Newport. Also 11 nieces and nephews who will greatly miss his sense of humor and quick wit.
