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- a/ Inseason estimates are preliminary.
- b/ Non-Indian coho fisheries are mark-selective prior to Sept., and non-mark-selective recreational fisheries occur in Sept., (except NOF rec.) see the regulations for details.
- c/ Numbers shown as Chinook quotas for non-Indian troll and recreational fisheries NOF are guidelines not quotas; only the total Chinook allowable catch is a quota.
- d/ Effort is reported as landings. Total allowable catch is 40,000 Chinook for Treaty Indian fisheries in 2022. The spring sub-quota is 20,000. The summer sub-quota is 34,525, which includes the original sub-quota (20,000 Chinook) plus the remaining spring quota which was rolled over on an impact-neutral basis (14,524 Chinook).
- e/ Open only to the Hecata Bank Line in March, April, June, and July.
- f/ Commercial troll monthly Chinook quotas may be transferred inseason on an impact neutral basis to the next opening period. In the Oregon KMZ, the Chinook preseason quotas were 800 in June, 400 in July, and 250 in August.
- g/ NOF recreational coho quotas may be adjusted from preseason due to impact neutral transfers between areas and from the NOF non-Indian troll fishery. The preseason quotas were: 17,470 coho and 6,110 Chinook in Neah Bay; 4,370 coho and 1,120 Chinook in La Push; 62,160 coho and 12,070 Chinook in Westport; and 84,000 coho and 7,700 Chinook in the Coubia River subarea.
- h/ Through inseason action the Neah Bay area was closed during July 5-24.
- i/ June 18- August 21 open to the OR/CA border.
- j/ Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt. recreational non-mark selective coho quota may be adjusted from preseason due to an impact neutral transfer from the recreational (mark-selective) coho quota. The preseason quota was 17,000 non marked coho.
- k/ Recreational estimates for May and June 2020 are excluded due to restrictions on sampling caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.
