Each region is developing a geographic strategic plan that aligns with the national strategic plan goals and strategies.




National Strategic Plan Goals

3.5 Improve workforce diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility



April - June	Draft GSP
June - Sept	Provide draft GSP to the Council, Tribes, and partners for feedback.
September	Receive feedback from the Council, Tribes, and partners.
Oct - Nov	Finalize West Coast GSP



Feedback

- Align NMFS work with local needs
- Engage with more diverse groups
- Support autonomy of Territorial and Tribal governments
- Collect demographic data
 - Fisheries, councils, agency
- Measure success by feedback from communities
- Concern with catch shares, aquaculture, and protected species



Feedback

- Implementation recommendations:
 - Communicate early and often with stakeholders
 - Work with the Council and other agencies
 - Coordinate our EEJ efforts with work that's already being done on the ground – connect with community organizations & other agencies
 - Support capacity for EEJ work
 - Support educational programs and opportunities



Status of NMFS EEJ Strategy

- National NMFS EEJ Work Group reviewed public comments and is currently revising the NMFS EEJ Strategy.
- Final NMFS EEJ Strategy is expected in late-Spring/early-Summer.
- Develop regional implementation plans
 - Develop process and timeline



West Coast Regional EEJ Implementation Plan

- Advance EEJ through meaningful engagement, coordination, and deliberation
- Iterative process including Council input
- Initial plan
 - Inventory existing EEJ efforts
 - Identify areas for improvement
 - Explore new opportunities that can be achieved with available resources
