Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold a Meeting September 7-14, 2023 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC or Council) and its advisory bodies will meet September 7-14, 2023 in Spokane, Washington and via webinar. The Council meeting will be live streamed with the opportunity to provide public comment in person and remotely. Advisory body meetings will be conducted via a combination of online and in-person formats as described on the last pages of the attached proposed agenda. Instructions for joining online meetings will be posted to the September 2023 Meeting webpage. Briefing materials will be available on our September 2023 Meeting webpage no later than Friday, August 18, 2023 by the end of the business day.

The Council is scheduled to address issues related to salmon, Pacific halibut, habitat, ecosystem, groundfish, highly migratory species (HMS), and administrative matters. Key actions for consideration at the meeting include:

- Identify the final salmon methodology review topics
- Adopt revised Salmon Fishery Management Plan (FMP) language for public review, necessary to clarify the review process for revising the southern resident killer whale Chinook threshold value
- Adopt proposed changes to the Pacific Halibut Catch Sharing Plan and commercial regulations to be implemented in 2024 or later
- Provide guidance on the development of Initiative 4 to the Fishery Ecosystem Plan, which would incorporate ecosystem and climate information into harvest and season-setting decision processes
- Adopt groundfish stock assessments for use in 2025 and beyond
- Adopt the final groundfish stock assessment methodology review topics
- Establish a purpose and need and range of alternatives (if possible) for groundfish fixed gear marking and entanglement risk reduction measures and limited entry follow on actions
- Discuss designation documents for the proposed Chumash Heritage National Marine Sanctuary
- Adopt the scope of fisheries and areas to be closed to promote coral restoration and research within the Greater Farallones and Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuaries
- Provide comments on the National Marine Fisheries Service Geographic Strategic Plan and Regional Equity and Environmental Justice Implementation Plan
- Adopt initial groundfish harvest specifications and management measures for 2025-2026
- Review the final report for Phase 1 of the trawl cost project and provide feedback for Phase 2. Recommend next steps for the trawl catch share and allocation reviews

- Adopt technical corrections to the yelloweye rockfish and sablefish harvest specifications and inseason adjustments for 2023 and 2024 fisheries, as needed
- Comment on the Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking for National Standards 4, 8, 9 and revised National Standard 1 Technical Guidance, as appropriate
- Provide recommendations on U.S. positions at upcoming international HMS meetings
- Adopt final recommendations on the issuance of HMS exempted fishing permits
- Adopt preliminary proposed essential fish habitat revisions in the HMS FMP for public review

The Council recommends that participants follow the COVID-19 guidelines provided by <u>local</u>, <u>State</u>, and <u>Federal</u> health authorities. Council process participants are encouraged to bring masks and tests to the meeting in the event they are needed. A limited supply of tests and masks will be available in the Secretariat and Council Ballroom.

All meetings are open to the public and there will be an opportunity to participate and provide oral testimony in person and remotely for the Council session. The meeting of the Council will be live streamed on the internet. The broadcast will begin at 9:00 AM on Saturday, September 9, 2023. Only the audio portion and presentations displayed on the screen will be broadcast. The audio portion for the public is listen-only except that an opportunity for oral public comment will be provided prior to Council Action on each agenda item. Supplemental materials will be posted as they are received and reviewed, but no later than the start of the Council meeting.
