SALMON TECHNICAL TEAM REPORT ON SALMON METHODOLOGY REVIEW – FINAL TOPIC SELECTION

At the April 2023 Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) meeting, the Council identified five topics for Methodology Review in 2023. The topics, and responsible entities were:

- 1. Consider technical modifications to the Sacramento River winter Chinook abundance forecast by examining whether an egg-to-fry covariate can improve forecast performance (assigned to National Marine Fisheries Service).
- 2. Review and consider improvements to methods used to model South of Falcon fisheries in Chinook Fishery Regulation Assessment Model (assigned to the Model Evaluation Workgroup [MEW]).
- 3. Explore alternative forecast approaches for the Oregon Production Index Hatchery coho forecast (assigned to Oregon Production Index Technical Team).
- 4. Explore alternative forecast approaches for the Sacramento Index (assigned to Salmon Technical Team [STT]).
- 5. Fishery Regulation Assessment Model (FRAM) documentation (assigned to MEW).

The STT discussed progress made on each of these topics, and expect that topics 1, 2, and 3 will be ready for the October 2023 Methodology Review meeting. Topic 4 will not be ready for review in 2023. For topic 5, the STT anticipates that a report describing recent updates to FRAM documentation will be available for discussion at the Methodology Review.
