# Monitoring and Minimizing Salmon Bycatch When Targeting Rockfish in the Shorebased IFQ Fishery

## 2023 Trawl Gear EFP Interim Report

The table below summarizes the catch of groundfish, Chinook salmon, other salmon, and other species of concern during the 2023 Trawl Gear EFP to date (through October 10, 2023).

In total, 165 Chinook salmon and 2 Coho salmon have been caught on 205 trips in the 2023 Trawl Gear EFP. The majority of salmon bycatch (150 Chinook and both Coho) occurred on 130 trips in the EFP North of 42° N. latitude. Only 15 Chinook salmon have been caught on 75 trips in the area South of 42° N. latitude. To date, this EFP has generated upwards of 12 million pounds of groundfish catch, valued at almost \$4 million. No other bycatch of species of concern has occurred in the 2023 EFP aside from Chinook and coho salmon.

None of the EFP bycatch thresholds have been reached this far this year, and none of the additional EFP provisions or the industry-based bycatch monitoring/avoidance measures (bycatch reports, move-along rules) have been triggered.
