Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold a Meeting April 5-11, 2024 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC or Council) and its advisory bodies will meet April 5-11, 2024 in Seattle, Washington and via webinar. The Council meeting will be live streamed with the opportunity to provide public comment in person and remotely starting Saturday, April 6, at 9 a.m., reconvening at 8 a.m. on Sunday, April 7 through Thursday, April 11, 2024. All meetings are open to the public, except for a Closed Session held from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m., Saturday, April 6, to address litigation and personnel matters. Advisory body meetings will be conducted via a combination of online and in-person formats as described on the last pages of the attached proposed agenda. Instructions for joining online meetings will be posted to the April 2024 Meeting webpage. Briefing materials will be available on the April 2024 Meeting webpage no later than Monday, March 25, 2024 by the end of the day.

The Council is scheduled to address issues related to salmon, groundfish, coastal pelagic species (CPS), Pacific halibut, and administrative matters. Several agenda items have impacts that span multiple Fishery Management Plans (FMPs) and are labeled "Cross FMP." Key actions for consideration at the meeting include:

- Adopt final management measures for 2024 ocean salmon fisheries
- Preliminary topic selection for the salmon methodology review
- Adopt final incidental Pacific halibut catch recommendations for 2024 and early 2025 non-Indian salmon troll fisheries
- National Marine Fisheries Service report on groundfish activities, including an overview from the Office of Protected Resources on the Take Reduction Team under the Marine Mammal Protection Act
- Final action on groundfish harvest specifications, if possible, and identification of preliminary preferred management measures for 2025-2026 fisheries, including a California quillback rockfish rebuilding plan
- Final action, including a Fishery Management Plan amendment, for sablefish gear switching in the Trawl Catch Share Program
- Adopt final inseason adjustments for 2024 groundfish fisheries
- Adopt final Coastal Pelagic Species exempted fishing permit recommendations for 2024-2025 fisheries
- Adopt final harvest specifications and management measures for the 2024-2025 Pacific sardine fishery

All meetings are open to the public and there will be an opportunity to participate and provide oral testimony in person and remotely for the Council session. The meeting of the Council will be live streamed on the internet. The broadcast will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 6, 2024. Only the audio portion and presentations displayed on the screen will be broadcast. The audio portion for the public is listen-only except that an opportunity for oral public comment will be provided prior to Council Action on each agenda item. It is recommended that you use a computer headset to listen to the meeting, but you may use your telephone for the audio-only portion of the meeting.

Advisory body meetings will be conducted in person and online according to the schedules in the attached proposed agenda. There will be an opportunity for public comment daily in each of the meetings. Written comments after the Council meeting starts will only be accepted if they are in support of oral public comment and are submitted via the <u>E-Portal</u> prior to Council Action on the agenda item.
