Implement the following changes:

TABLE 1

North of Falcon Commercial Management Alternatives, page 3

U.S./Canada Border to Cape Falcon (summer season)

- Alternative II – change Chinook landing and possession limit for July 1-10 from 80 to 60

TABLE 2

North of Falcon Recreational Management Alternatives, page 14

Queets River to Leadbetter Point (Westport Subarea)

- Replace “NO CHINOOK RETENTION June 30-July 30 on Fridays or Saturdays” with “NO CHINOOK RETENTION on Fridays or Saturdays during July,” and add “Possession of Chinook salmon is illegal when Chinook retention is prohibited in the area.”

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.

- Alternative III: At the end of the regulation specifications, add the following language. Beginning October 1, open shoreward of the 40-fathom regulatory line (C.5.f).

Cape Falcon to OR/CA Border

Mark-selective coho fishery:

Alternative I:

- Replace the mark selective coho quota of 60,000 with 50,000

Alternative II:

- Replace the mark selective coho quota of 50,000 with 45,000
- Replace the first “Same as Alternative I” with:
 - Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.: Open seven days per week. For the period of June 22-July 31 All salmon, two salmon per day, all retained coho must be marked with a healed adipose fin clip (C.1). For the period of August 1-18 All salmon except Chinook, two salmon per day, all retained coho must be marked with a healed adipose fin clip (C.1). See minimum size limits (B). See gear restrictions and definitions (C.2, C.3).
 - Humbug Mt. to the OR/CA Border: Open seven days per week. For the period of June 22-August 18 All salmon, two salmon per day, all retained coho must be marked with a healed adipose fin clip (C.1). See minimum size limits (B). See gear restrictions and definitions (C.2, C.3).

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.

Non-mark-selective coho fishery:

Alternative I:

- Replace the September non-mark-selective coho quota of 35,000 with 30,000

Alternative II:

- Replace the September non-mark-selective coho quota of 30,000 with 27,500

Alternative 1:

Include the Sacramento River Fall Chinook recreational allocation of 9.2% of the total allowable harvest.

Alternative 2:

include the Sacramento River Fall Chinook recreational allocation of 50% of the total allowable harvest.
