Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold a Meeting June 7-13, 2024 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC or Council) and its advisory bodies will meet June 7-13, 2024 in San Diego, California and via webinar. The Council meeting will be live streamed with the opportunity to provide public comment in person and remotely starting Saturday, June 8, at 10 a.m., reconvening at 8 a.m. on Sunday, June 9 through Thursday, June 13, 2024. All meetings are open to the public, except for a Closed Session held from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m., Saturday, June 8, to address litigation and personnel matters. Advisory body meetings will be conducted via a combination of online and in-person formats as described on the last pages of the attached proposed agenda. Instructions for joining online meetings will be posted to the June 2024 Meeting webpage. Briefing materials will be available on the June 2024 Meeting webpage no later than Friday, May 17, 2024 by the end of the day.

The Council is scheduled to address issues related to salmon, groundfish, highly migratory species, coastal pelagic species, and administrative matters. Several agenda items have impacts that span multiple Fishery Management Plans (FMPs) and are labeled "Cross FMP." Key actions for consideration at the meeting include:

- Receive a progress report on the Sacramento River Fall Chinook Workgroup
- Receive a progress report on the Queets Spring/Summer Chinook rebuilding plan
- Final action to close areas to groundfish commercial bottom contact gears within the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary (Ano Nuevo, Ascension Canyon, and Sur Ridge) to support coral research and restoration
- Adopt a final groundfish stock assessment plan for 2025, including a Terms of Reference for conducting the assessments. Adopt a preliminary list of species for assessment in 2027, which will be finalized at the June 2026 Council meeting
- Adopt a purpose and need and range of alternatives necessary to define the groundfish stocks scheduled for assessment in 2025 and 2027
- Final action on fixed gear marking and entanglement risk reduction measures in the commercial groundfish fishery
- Final action on groundfish harvest specifications, management measures, including a California quillback rebuilding plan, and exempted fishing permits for 2025-26
- Adopt final inseason adjustments for 2024 groundfish fisheries
- Adopt final coastal pelagic species stock assessment Terms of Reference and accepted practices

- Consider recommendations from the Council Executive Director regarding improvements to Council operations
- Review the composition of all term-limited Advisory Body positions (Scientific and Statistical Committee at-large positions; Habitat Committee tribal, industry, conservation, and at-large positions; and all Advisory Subpanel positions) and adopt proposed changes for public review. Review the composition and charge of Ad Hoc Committees and adopt proposed changes for public review, as appropriate

The declared COVID health emergency is over; however, the Council recommends that participants follow the COVID-19 guidelines provided by <u>local</u>, <u>State</u>, and <u>Federal</u> health authorities. Council participants are encouraged to bring masks and tests to the meeting in the event they are needed. A limited supply of tests and masks will be available in the Council Ballroom.

All meetings are open to the public and there will be an opportunity to participate and provide oral testimony in person and remotely for the Council session. The meeting of the Council will be live streamed on the internet. The broadcast will begin at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 8, 2024. The meeting will continue daily at 8:00 a.m. through Thursday, June 13. Broadcasts end daily at 5:00 p.m. or when business for the day is complete. Only the audio portion and presentations displayed on the screen will be broadcast. The audio portion for the public is listen-only except that an opportunity for oral public comment will be provided prior to Council Action on each agenda item. It is recommended that you use a computer headset to listen to the meeting, but you may use your telephone for the audio-only portion of the meeting.

Advisory body meetings will be conducted in person and online according to the schedules in the attached proposed agenda. There will be an opportunity for public comment daily in each of the meetings. Instructions for how to connect to meetings being held via webinar will be posted on the Council's <u>June Meeting webpage</u> prior to the first day of the meeting.



Supplemental materials will be posted as they are received and reviewed, but no later than the start of the Council meeting.

Written comments after the Council meeting starts will only be accepted if they are in support of oral public comment and are submitted via the <u>E-Portal</u> prior to Council Action on the agenda item.
