Changes to Personnel

Inflation Reduction Act Funding

At the date of drafting this report, the Council continues to await a formal announcement regarding Inflation Reduction Act proposals and related funding. Recent dialog with NMFS headquarters indicates that decisions are coming "soon" and may be made prior to the Council Coordination Committee meeting (May 21st through May 23rd).
