

## FINAL 2025 PRESEASON MANAGEMENT SCHEDULE

In order to plan, announce, and meet *Federal Register* deadlines for public hearing sites and the entire preseason salmon management process, Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) staff needs to confirm details of the process prior to the end of November each year. The proposed process and schedule for 2025 are provided in Agenda Item F.4, Attachment 1. This proposed schedule is tentative and subject to change, and the Council web page will be the best resource for the most current information regarding the upcoming preseason salmon schedule.

For the 2025 salmon public hearings hosted by the Council, staff recommend holding one public hearing for each coastal state to discuss the salmon management alternatives. The proposed public hearings would be:

- Monday, March 24, 2025 - Washington (WA) hearing (Westport, in person), and Oregon (OR) hearing (online)
- Tuesday, March 25, 2025 – California (CA) hearing (Santa Rosa, in person)

In recent years, the hearings held in Westport, WA and Santa Rosa, CA have been well attended and there appears to be general support to maintain those venues in future years. The OR hearing has been in person (Coos Bay area) or online. The online format increases accessibility, however, there is value in holding these hearings in person. Council staff recommend the OR hearing be in person every third year, and that location could rotate to also help boost attendance and reach a variety of OR coastal communities. This recommendation is consistent with testimony heard at the 2024 OR hearing. Under this scenario, the next in person hearing in OR would be 2026.

If health and safety concerns arise, the venue(s) may be changed to an online meeting. The Council does not have the technical capacity to conduct hybrid meetings of this nature, so each meeting will be in-person, or online, but not both.

In 2025, the March Council meeting is scheduled to occur in Vancouver, Washington and the April Council meeting is scheduled to occur in San Jose, California. Therefore, the public comment period regarding the tentative adoption of management measures for analysis at the April Council meeting also serves as a public comment opportunity. If the states desire to have additional hearings, staff suggests states organize and staff them as was done in past years.
