Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold a Meeting November 13-18, 2024 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC or Council) and its advisory bodies will meet November 13-18, 2024 in Costa Mesa, California and via webinar. The Council meeting will be live streamed with the opportunity to provide public comment in person and remotely starting November 14, at 10 a.m., reconvening at 8 a.m. November 15 through November 18, 2024. All meetings are open to the public, except for a Closed Session held from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. November 14, to address litigation and personnel matters. Advisory body meetings will be conducted via a combination of online and in-person formats as described on the last pages of the attached proposed agenda. Instructions for joining online meetings will be posted to the November 2024 Meeting webpage. Briefing materials will be available on the November 2024 Meeting webpage no later than October 25, 2024 by the end of the day.

The Council is scheduled to address issues related to salmon, Pacific halibut, highly migratory species, groundfish, coastal pelagic species, and administrative matters. Several agenda items have impacts that span multiple Fishery Management Plans (FMPs) and are labeled "Cross FMP." Key actions for consideration at the meeting include:

Cross FMP

- Marine Planning
- Research and Data Needs: Identify the top management and science challenges to inform the Council's multi-year research priorities for fisheries, fisheries interactions, habitats, and other areas of research that are necessary for management

Salmon

- Adopt final methods for estimating the impacts of the Council's salmon management. Adopt revisions to Council Operating Procedure 15 regarding the roles and responsibilities of Council advisory bodies during the salmon methodology reviews. These revisions will be adopted for public review and considered for final approval at the March 2025 meeting under the Membership Appointments and Council Operating Procedures agenda item
- Select a final preferred alternative for rebuilding Queets River Spring/Summer Chinook salmon
- Adopt the final preseason management schedule for establishing the 2025 ocean salmon fisheries
- Discuss the Klamath and Sacramento River Fall Chinook Workgroup reports and adopt any recommendations, as appropriate

Pacific Halibut

- Adopt the final 2025 Catch Sharing Plan and fishery regulations
- Adopt final measures for the commercial Pacific halibut fishery including requirements to use vessel monitoring systems, seabird avoidance measures (i.e., streamer lines), and to report the number of Pacific halibut on fish tickets

Highly Migratory Species (HMS)

- Provide recommendations on U.S. positions at upcoming international meetings and domestic management measures necessary to abide by Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission resolution that sets the U.S. biennial and annual commercial catch limits and calls for consistent measures for recreational fisheries. To conform with the commercial catch limits, National Marine Fisheries Service will modify domestic commercial Pacific bluefin trip limits based on a recommendation from the Council
- Provide any further recommendations stock status determination criteria, if necessary. Consider modifications to the current HMS species incidental landing limit for the small mesh drift gillnet fishery
- Discuss the HMS Roadmap Workshop Report and provide guidance on next steps

Groundfish

- Oldentify hearing officers and meeting locations for the 2025 Trawl Catch Share Program and Intersector Allocation Reviews. The trawl program review will evaluate the performance of the shorebased individual fishing quota (all gear types), mothership, and catcher-processor sectors. The intersector allocation review will cover species that have long-term allocations in the Groundfish Fishery Management Plan as well as species that are allocated every two years
- Adopt the final methods to be used in the 2025 groundfish stock assessments and select the fishery impact models that will be improved prior to the 2027-2028 management cycle
- Adopt the final stock definitions for species that are scheduled for assessment in 2025 and 2027
- Adopt a range of alternatives and preliminary preferred alternative for modifying the fishing regulations governing the Cordell Bank Conservation Area
- Inseason adjustments for 2024-25 fisheries including Pacific whiting annual catch limit deductions for bycatch of whiting in other fisheries and technical corrections to the 2025-26 harvest specifications and management measures

Coastal Pelagic Species

- Adopt a final Pacific sardine rebuilding plan including a Fishery Management Plan amendment
- Prioritize stocks scheduled for assessment in 2026, 2027, and beyond as appropriate

The declared COVID health emergency is over; however, the Council recommends that participants follow the COVID-19 and respiratory illness guidelines provided by <u>local</u>, <u>State</u>, and <u>Federal</u> health authorities. Council participants are encouraged to bring masks and tests to the

meeting in the event they are needed. A limited supply of tests and masks will be available in the Council Ballroom.

All meetings are open to the public and there will be an opportunity to participate and provide oral testimony in person and remotely for the Council session. The meeting of the Council will be live streamed on the internet. The broadcast will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 14, 2024. The meeting will continue daily at 8:00 a.m. through Monday, November 18. Broadcasts end daily at 5:00 p.m. or when business for the day is complete. Only the audio portion and presentations displayed on the screen will be broadcast. The audio portion for the public is listen-only except that an opportunity for oral public comment will be provided prior to Council Action on each agenda item. To access the meeting online, please visit the November 2024 Meeting webpage. It is recommended that you use a computer headset to listen to the meeting, but you may use your telephone for the audio-only portion of the meeting.

Advisory body meetings will be conducted in person and online according to the schedules in the attached proposed agenda. There will be an opportunity for public comment daily in each of the meetings. Instructions for how to connect to meetings being held via webinar will be posted on the Council's <u>November 2024 Meeting webpage</u> prior to the first day of the meeting.

Public Comment Guidelines

Supplemental

materials will be posted as they are received and reviewed, but no later than the start of the Council meeting.
