## Pacific Fishery Management Council to Hold a Meeting March 4-11, 2025 to Adopt Management Measures for Ocean Fisheries

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC or Council) and its advisory bodies will meet March 4-11, 2025 in Vancouver, Washington and via webinar. The Council meeting will be live streamed with the opportunity to provide public comment in person and remotely starting March 6, 2025 at 9 a.m., reconvening at 8 a.m. March 7 through March 11, 2025. All meetings are open to the public, except for a Closed Session held from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. March 6, to address litigation and personnel matters. Advisory body meetings will be conducted via a combination of online and in-person formats as described on the last pages of the attached proposed agenda. Instructions for joining online meetings will be posted to the <u>March 2025 Meeting webpage</u>. Briefing materials will be available on the <u>March 2025 Meeting webpage</u> no later than February 14, 2025 by the end of the day.

The Council is scheduled to address issues related to Pacific halibut, salmon, ecosystem, groundfish, highly migratory species (HMS), and administrative matters. Several agenda items have impacts that span multiple Fishery Management Plans (FMPs) and are labeled "Cross FMP." Key actions for consideration at the meeting include:

The declared COVID health emergency is over; however, the Council recommends that participants follow the COVID-19 and respiratory illness guidelines provided by local, State, and <u>Federal</u> health authorities. Council participants are encouraged to bring masks and tests to the meeting in the event they are needed. A limited supply of tests and masks will be available in the Council Ballroom.

All meetings are open to the public and there will be an opportunity to participate and provide oral testimony in person and remotely for the Council session. The meeting of the Council will be live streamed on the internet. The broadcast will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 6, 2025. The meeting will continue daily at 8:00 a.m. through Tuesday, March 11. Broadcasts end daily at 5:00 p.m. or when business for the day is complete. Only the audio portion and presentations displayed on the screen will be broadcast. The audio portion for the public is listen-only except that an opportunity for oral public comment will be provided prior to Council Action on each agenda item. It is recommended that you use a computer headset to listen to the meeting, but you may use your telephone for the audio-only portion of the meeting.

Written comments after the Council meeting starts will only be accepted if they are in support of oral public comment and are submitted via the <u>E-Portal</u> prior to Council Action on the agenda item.
