E.3 WDFW Motion North of Falcon:

I move that the Council adopt for Salmon Technical Team compilation and analysis the proposed initial salmon management alternatives for the 2025 non-Indian ocean fisheries between Cape Falcon and the U.S./Canada border as developed by the Salmon Advisory Subpanel and described in Agenda Item E.3.e, Supplemental SAS Report 1, March 6, 2025, with the following modifications:

For the North of Falcon non-Indian fishery, add quotas of 130,000 marked coho in Alternative I, 115,000 marked coho in Alternative II, and 100,000 marked coho in Alternative III. Calculate all commercial/recreational and sub-area allocations consistent with Fishery Management Plan defined sharing throughout Tables 1 and 2.

U.S./Canada Border to Cape Alava (Neah Bay Subarea)

Cape Alava to Queets River (La Push Subarea)

- Adjust starting date for all-species season to July 1, change daily limit to 2 salmon daily limit (delete 'of which only one may be a Chinook')

Queets River to Leadbetter Point (Westport Subarea)

Alternative I:

- Add June 21 June 27 season, 1 salmon daily limit, only Chinook may be retained
- Adjust starting date for all-species season to June 28

Leadbetter Point to Cape Falcon (Columbia River Subarea)

Alternative I:

- Add June 21 June 27 season, 1 salmon daily limit, only Chinook may be retained
- Adjust starting date for all-species season to June 28

 Change daily limit to 'All salmon, two salmon per day, no more than one of which may be a Chinook'

E.3 Tribal Motion:

I move the Council adopt for STT analysis the following initial Treaty Troll salmon management measures:

Tribes

Alternative I: 55,000 Chinook and 50,000 coho

Alternative III: 35,000 Chinook and 20,000 coho

The alternatives consist of a May 1 – June 30 Chinook-directed fishery and a July 1 start date to the all-species fishery (Chinook and coho). Season structure with regard to the closing date is still under discussion among the tribes. The Chinook quota should be evenly split between the two time periods.
