

Project Elements



Council Discussion/Consideration to Date

- September 2023, November 2023, January 2024, and September 2024: Council received/discussed updates on project proposals; funding received in September 2024.
- December 2024: All-Advisory Body kick-off meeting held online.
- March 2025: Council discussed possible alignment of Adaptive Management project with groundfish new management measures/priorities; signaled support for broader, cross-FMP discussion at April Council meeting.
- April 2025: Council staff supplemental attachment provides some examples of tools and approaches to increase flexibility and capacity for adaptive management.
- Today's agenda item: An opportunity for the Council to review and discuss AB input and public comment and consider whether to identify actions and next steps for Adaptive Mgmt. project.

Council Tasks

- 1) Consider Adaptive Management project updates.
- 2) Review and discuss opportunities to build additional adaptive management into the Council's FMPs.
- 3) Provide initial guidance on priority issues and actions for consideration under the Adaptive Management project, as appropriate.

Other Questions for Consideration

- What problems around adaptive capacity does the Council wish to solve?
- What would the Council like to be adaptive to, and how?

From Adaptive Management project proposal: "Climate change will likely affect the availability and distribution of target, non-target, protected, and unmanaged species in Council-managed fisheries. Shifts in availability and distribution could happen on relatively short time scales, requiring faster management responses. This effort responds to a dominant theme emerging from the Council's FEP Climate and Communities Initiative scenario planning exercise and addresses the corresponding goal to develop and implement strategies for improving the flexibility and responsiveness to near-term climate shift and long-term climate change."
