I move to tentatively adopt the management measures for non-Indian fisheries NOF as presented in Agenda Item F.1.e, Supplemental SAS Report 1 with the following modifications:

U.S./Canada Border to Cape Falcon, May 6-June 28:

In the area between the U.S./Canada border and the Queets River, **May 6 through May 15, the landing and possession limit is 100 Chinook per vessel for the open period, then May 16 through June 28, the landing and possession limit is 50 Chinook per vessel per landing week (Thurs.-Wed.) (C.1, C.6).**

In the area between Leadbetter Point and Cape Falcon, **May 6 through May 15, landing and possession limit of 100 Chinook per vessel for the open period, then May 16 through June 28, landing and possession limit of 50 Chinook per vessel per landing week (Thurs.-Wed.) (C.1, C.6).**

U.S./Canada Border to Cape Falcon, Jul 1 – Sep 30:

Delete line referencing Chinook landing and possession limit in area between U.S./Canada border and Queets River. (There will be no Chinook landing/possession limits to start the summer season in any area.) Coho landing/possession limit of 150 for entire area remains unchanged.
